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ST. LOUIS COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION FAIR PLAY POLICY & BEHAVIOR POLICY

Our goal is to provide for personal growth in a safe environment. Please assist us in maintaining a safe and enjoyable environment by following the Fair Play Policy.

Individuals using the St. Louis County facilities are expected to:

1. Wear appropriate attire in recreation facilities, this includes a shirt and shoes in the recreation complex.
2. Refrain from using profane language.
3. Refrain from placing themselves and/or others at risk (i.e. hitting, fighting, biting, kicking, spitting, etc...)
4. Respect one another and one another's belongings.
5. Not participate in any unlawful activities (i.e. illegal drugs, weapons, vandalism, stealing, etc...)
6. When participating in recreation programs, remain with the instructors, following directions to the best of their ability and refrain from disrupting the class.

Persons endangering the safety of themselves or others will be removed from the park facility or recreation program. Other infractions of the rules will be handed as deemed necessary by the recreation staff.

Children who misbehave or break camp rules will be given a series of check marks leading up to a "strike". We reserve the right to bypass one or more steps in this process if a situation warrants it.

Modifications to these rules maybe made to accommodate individual needs.

- 1st Offense: Child will be given a five (5) minute time out.
- 2nd Offense: Child will be given a ten (10) minute time out.
- 3rd Offense: A "strike" will be given.

Not cooperating while disciplined will result in additional time added to a time out.

- 1st Strike: Conference with Camp Director, Recreation Supervisor, child and parents.
- 2nd Strike: Conference with Camp Director, Recreation Supervisor, Complex Manager, child and parents, suspension from camp for 3 days.
- 3rd Strike: Dismissed from camp with NO REFUND.

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NORTH COUNTY DAY CAMP RULES & POLICIES

1. Campers must follow St. Louis County Parks and Recreation Fair Play Policy. Please share this policy with your child.
2. All campers must have a completed Participant Information/Medical Release Form on file by the first day of camp. Campers are not allowed to have medication of any kind during day camp hours. Day Camp Staff will NOT administer medications of any kind to camp participants. (Exceptions can be made for prescription medications if the "Consent to Administer Medication" form is properly filled out.)
3. Campers, for their own safety, should wear comfortable clothing suitable for outdoor activities. No sandals, flip flops or open toed shoes except on the pool deck. If proper footwear is not worn, the parent will be notified and asked to bring proper footwear for child or they will be sent home.
4. LUNCH: Please send a nonperishable lunch with a drink(s) to camp every day. Mark the lunch box/bag with the child's name.
5. WATER: The weather during camp is usually hot. Drinking fountains are available, but are not always cold. We suggest you send extra bottles of water to camp with your child. Label clearly with the child's name. Hint: Freezing a bottle of water with a squirt top allows for cold water for your child as the ice melts.
6. SWIMMING: Camp Eagle's Nest participants will swim most days, weather permitting. Proper swim attire is required. Please, no leotards, shorts with zippers or belt loops, etc. Label swim bags and towels clearly with child's name. Swim bags should be plastic. We recommend you send sunscreen on a daily basis and instruct your child on how to apply sunscreen.
7. Programs are limited to registered participants only. No visitors or guests permitted.
8. DROP-OFF / PICK-UP: Parents should be punctual in dropping off and picking up campers. Drop-off and pick-up location is at the park shelter. ALL campers MUST be signed in and out. Staff supervision begins at 9:00 am and ends at 3:00 pm unless a camper is enrolled in day camp before or after care. Please notify the Day Camp Director IN WRITING if your child will be dropped off later or picked up earlier than these times.
9. BEFORE CARE: Must be prepaid. Supervision begins at 7:00 am. Campers may not be dropped off any earlier.
10. AFTER CARE: Must be prepaid. Supervision ends at 6:00 pm. It is essential that campers be picked up on time from camp.
11. All campers must have an Authorized Walk, Ride, Pick-Up Release form on file. Children without Release forms will not be allowed to walk or ride bikes to/from camp at any time. Children will not be released to anyone who is not on the Authorized Pick-Up Release form. Please keep this form up to date.
12. Late pick-ups will be handled on a case-by-case basis by the Camp Director and/or Recreation Supervisor. A penalty of \$1 per every minute late will be assessed.
