As Wildlife Gardeners, children will gain an understanding and strengthen their appreciation for the wildlife that is part of their local community. They will also enjoy novel, hands-on project based learning as they have fun learning to garden for wildlife, building components of wildlife habitat, and taking part in an integrated curriculum that will strengthen skills in math, science, language and social studies.

Health & Nutrition Mar 17- Apr 14

Children understand how their food choices affect not only their own health, but also farmers, the environment, and your local community. Students will discover where food comes from, how our bodies use food, and what happens to food waste. They'll participate in the ecological cycle of food production, compost formation, and recycling back to the soil.
