**St Louis County Department of Public Health Notified of Second Presumptive Positive COVID-19 Case**

St. Louis County, MO —March 13, 2020. The St. Louis County Department of Public Health (DPH) has been notified of a second presumptive positive case of COVID-19 in a St. Louis County resident. This is a domestic travel related case and the patient is in the age range of 50-60 years of age.

The first confirmed case of COVID-19 in St. Louis County was on March 7, 2020 and the second presumed positive will be sent to the Centers for Disease Control Prevention for confirmation testing. Please note, the second presumptive case is not related to the first.

Anyone identified during the investigation as a close contact or at risk of exposure to this patient will be contacted directly by the St. Louis County Department of Public Health.

Anyone experiencing symptoms of a fever, cough or difficulty breathing and have reason to believe they have encountered a person infected with COVID-19 should call the St. Louis County Health Line at 314-615-2660.
